A management company has taken over Strikes Bowling Alley in Ely and insists the lanes are still very much open for business.

Independent Hospitality Solutions took on the alley and adjoining Planet Zoom this month, despite plans to make the building the new HQ for the county council archives.

Director Matt Barnwell said the council's plans were still some way off and Strikes would be open for the "foreseeable future".

He said: "We have one of the biggest venues in Ely that is sitting here and is not being used and we would like to work with the people and let them know that we are here, open for business and happy to help."

The alley has 15 full and part-time staff and Mr Barnwell said he is welcoming applications for summer jobs. He added: "We are still here, we are still open and, at the moment, we have had no message to tell us otherwise."

Mr Barnwell added that the alley would be given a three-month period of notice should the county council press ahead with its archive plans.

The diocese's annual report revealed that a "better than expected" performance from the church's investment pot produced £144,000 in interest and dividends.

Other savings in IT and staffing levels in the diocesan office helped boost the total surplus to

A large chunk of the surplus will be used to fund a new initiative, called Ely 2025, which aims to develop and expand the church and its buildings across the diocese.

Diosesan secretary Paul Evans said: "Ely 2025 would also consolidate other growth and mission provisions in the general reserve. The fund would be subject to strict application."
